The O'Fallon Garden Club is both a service and a social organization. At our monthly membership meetings, we meet with fellow gardeners and hear a presentation on some aspect of gardening from local expert gardeners. Service activities include planting and maintenance of the Community Garden's flower and vegetable beds, harvesting veggies for the O'Fallon Food Bank, and maintaining the area around raised rental beds, apiary, and walkways, benches, sheds and compost bins. We also design, plant, and maintain the West State Street Roundabout. To fund these activities, we hold several annual fundraisers (see below). All these activities are performed voluntarily by Club members. While members are encouraged to volunteer, it is not a requirement, but without enough volunteer help we may need to reduce some of these activities.
